May 4, 2011

Co-President Ginny LoDuca brought the meeting to order at 7:04 pm by asking for the chatter to be kept down during the meeting. She welcomed all in attendance as well as our speaker, Beth Helfter. Motions were made, seconded, and passed to accept the Treasurer's and Secretary's Reports as printed in the newsletter. Harriet Pindell and Doris Lewis spoke on behalf of the Nominating Committee and announced the proposed slate for next year: Ginny LoDuca and Regina Mohan to remain as Co-Presidents; Harriet to remain as Vice President; Marie Anderson to remain as Treasurer; Linda Panny to join the Board as Secretary; Cath Hallsworth to join as Member-At-Large. The membership voted on the slate and the new Board was accepted. Thanks were given to Karen Hoyt and Angie Callbeck as they leave the Board.

Regina Mohan read info sent to the Guild regarding the Bennington Vt Quilt Festival. Committee Reports began with Terry McPartland reading thank-you notes from Loaves and Fishes and My Father's House. Linda Pearl spoke about the upcoming Carol Doak Workshop, and then announced that she will be doing the Publicity for the Guild Quilt Show in September. She welcomed Jeane Brown back to the Guild then spoke about a successful program Jeane implemented at our last show, where members "adopt" a quilt shop and keep them supplied with info about the show. She also spoke about a privately-run bus trip that she and Stacie Keefe are offering to the Vermont Quilt Festival.

Mary Wood thanked Kathie Beltz for photographing the Raffle Quilt and making up the cards and raffle tickets. A gift was chosen from participants and was won by Mary Lou Sanborn. Harriet asked for help in running

the Café at the Show. Susan Parks thanks those who have offered to make or help with Raffle Baskets. Reg spoke with someone at the Hannah Dustin show and was told their raffle baskets were very profitable. Co-Chairman Ellen Sellin reported that they are holding a Show meeting on May 16.

Membership Chair Wanda Makela reported that there were 104 in attendance, with 5 guests and one new member. Wanda briefly spoke about a nationally-known teacher, Marcy Baker, coming to her shop in November. Stacie Keefe announced that there was no Block of the Month to give away, but she gave out new patterns for next month. Doris Lewis announced that the Quilt Cupboard has given out 65 quilts since September. Several were shown. She asks those with a need for quilts over the summer to call Doris or Barbara Forslind. JoAnn drew Raffle winners Doris, Mickey Crocker, Harriet, Dorry Swain and Peg Russell. The big prize went to Barbara Forslind. The evening's speaker, Guild member Beth Helfter, entertained the crowd with amusing stories and lovely quilts. Show and Tell was held after her presentation, after which the meeting was adjourned.

at The New England Quilt Museum
and The American Textile History Museum
in Lowell Massachusetts

Fabric, Fashions, & Quilts:

From the Armistice to Pearl Harbor

This collaborative study symposium will examine 20th Century textiles as produced and used during the 1920s and 1930s, featuring two talks and a series of three concurrent, rotating sessions that all attendees will be able to attend. The Opening Address by Madelyn Shaw will be *Between the Wars: Textiles and Clothing in American Society, 1918-1941*. The Keynote Address by Merikay Waldvogel will be *Soft Covers for Hard Times: What Role Did Quilts Play in the 1930s*, an examination of the context of quilt making during the late 1920s and 1930s. Sessions featuring Giles Kotcher– *Decorative Arts and Designers, 1920-1940*, an overview of decorative arts and designers of the period; Diane Fagan Affleck and Karen Herbaugh–*Printing a Look: Fashions and Fabric Between the Wars*, an opportunity to view primary source materials from the archives of the ATHM; Merikay Waldvogel, Cyndi Black and Stephanie Hatch–*Soft Covers for Hard Times*, a quilt-turning with comments on quilts from the 1920s and 30s; a Buffet Lunch at the Gazebo Café and Tour of the ATHM exhibit; and Grace and Glamour: *Fashions of the 1930s*, are included as part of the Registration Fee. A Show and Tell, which concludes the Symposium, invites attendees

to bring and share their quilts and ephemera from the era covered by the symposium. Following the Symposium, there will be time for attendees to view the NEQM exhibition *Maine's Quilt Heritage*. Symposium attendance is by registration only. Deadline date to register is October 03, 2011.
